The Wythe-Bland Community Foundation Scholarship Program will provide **full tuition and fees** for all qualified Wythe and Bland County high school graduates – beginning with the Class of 2007– to attend Wytheville Community College.

To qualify, you must:

- Provide proof of residence in Wythe or Bland County for at least the two years prior to graduation;
- Have attended a public or private high school in Wythe or Bland County for at least the junior and senior years.
 - *Students who complete a GED by the graduation date of their original graduating class are eligible for the program provided they satisfy the other eligibility requirements.*
 - *Home-schooled students are eligible for the program provided they meet WCC entrance requirements and other eligibility requirements.*



To apply, you must:

- Complete an Application for Admission to Wytheville Community College;
- Provide an official high school transcript;
- Complete a current FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form and have a completed financial aid file;
- Complete the required Wythe-Bland Community Foundation Scholarship Program application form;
- Apply for any other available scholarships or grants that may be available to the recipient, including those available through Wytheville Community College; and
- Enroll in a degree/diploma/certificate curriculum or in a program that is at least one year in length.

You must also:

- Complete 40 hours of community (volunteer) service with an approved agency by the end of the first year; and
- Achieve a 2.0 grade point average by the end of the first year and complete 67% of all classes to continue receiving the grant for the second year.
